



India COVID-19 Travel Update - February 26, 2021

U.S. citizens are permitted to enter India, depending on the purpose of travel.

Travel to India is suspended for all nationals except for those holding a recently issued business visa, holders of an Employment, J-1 or J1X visas, healthcare professionals holding a letter of invitation from a recognized and registered healthcare facility, technical specialists and engineers traveling for installation repair and maintenance and Engineering, managerial, design or other specialists travelling to India on behalf of foreign business entities located in India Travelers who are exempt from the entry ban must enter India via non-scheduled commercial/chartered flights, trains, ships or other transport from the following countries:

Afghanistan, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Canada, Ethiopia, France, Germany, Iraq, Japan, Kenya, Kuwait, Maldives, Nepal, Netherlands, Nigeria, Oman, Qatar, Rwanda, Tanzania, Ukraine, United Arab Emirates and United States

All travelers will be required to complete a self-declaration form 72 hours before the schedule travel and upload a negative COVID-19 test result issued no more than 72 hours before arrival via

Travelers traveling to India due to a case of a death of a family member are exempt from uploading the COVID-19 test prior to arrival and will be tested upon arrival instead. They will need to apply for this exemption 72 hours before departure via
