



Indonesia COVID-19 Travel Update

****The closure of Indonesian international borders to foreign nationals shall commence on 1 January and run until 14 January 2021 (can be extended as needed)****

Entry and Exit Requirements

- Are U.S. citizens permitted to enter? Yes, but only with a valid residence permit (KITAS or KITAP). Foreign visitors are prohibited from transiting and traveling to Indonesian Territory unless they are in possession of a valid residence permit. Visa-free and visa-on-arrival entry for all foreign travelers, including U.S. citizens, remains suspended. The government has not indicated a timeline for when international visitors will be able to enter the country.
- Is a negative COVID-19 test (PCR and/or serology) required for entry? Yes. Per new government regulations, from 22 December to 14 January inclusive, travelers are required to have a negative COVID-19 PCR test obtained within 48-hours of their arrival and present it to the Indonesian health authorities. These restrictions change frequently, and may be extended. Travelers should regularly consult with their airline for the most up to date information.
- Are health screening procedures in place at airports and other ports of entry? Yes. Following a health screening, which may include a PCR test, travelers are required to quarantine at their own expense at a government designated hotel for five days. Travelers will then be required to take a mandatory COVID-19 PCR test and have a negative result before proceeding to their destination.

Quarantine Information:

- Are U.S. citizens required to quarantine? Yes.
- All foreign visitors arriving in Indonesia are required to:
 - Hold a health certificate issued by health authorities from their home countries
 - Undertake a mandatory 14-day quarantine at designated facilities conducted by the Indonesian government or self-quarantine under supervision of the Indonesian health authority
 - If you do not have a valid negative COVID test upon arrival to Indonesia, the government will test you upon arrival at the airport. You must agree to be quarantined if you test positive.

Fines for Non-Compliance: (if applicable)

- Individuals who do not comply with existing social distancing policies and regulations are subject to fines and other penalties.
